Coalition Building – Bringing together organizations, agencies, and individuals to work toward a common goal of developing services to help the agricultural population.	_____
<i>Network Support</i>	
Provider Training – Educating professional providers of behavioral health services (i.e.: mental health, addictions) about agricultural behavioral health.	_____
<i>System Development</i>	
Advocacy – Contacting and providing education about SSoH to elected and appointed officials, planners, foundations, donors and other persons in a position to support the SSoH cause.	_____
<i>Service Delivery (Direct & Indirect Services)</i>	
Social Marketing – Disseminating information about SSoH to the general public through a variety of ways including: newspaper articles, radio/television ads or programs, displays at events.	_____
<i>Service Delivery (Direct & Indirect Services)</i>	
Hotline – Free, confidential telephone hotline for crisis counseling and/or referrals.	_____
Vouchers – Voucher given to a person in order to assist with the cost of outpatient behavioral health services	_____
Outreach – Services provided by trained outreach workers. This includes crisis counseling and other types of support to individuals and families.	_____
Support Group – A single meeting or series of meetings for persons to gather together to discuss specific issues of concern among them.	_____
Educational Retreat – A gathering of people to focus on one or more behavioral health issues of concern to persons involved in agriculture, may be for one day or a few days.	_____
Community Education – Providing information or programs at community meetings and events to improve the understanding of the general population about agricultural behavioral health. (i.e., speaking at Rotary Club.)	_____
Information Clearinghouse – Providing information to persons who ask for it, usually on an individual basis through website, email, telephone, or in person. Usually information is designed to answer specific questions.	_____
